



“Appledore’s Lone Arrangers”!!

Well – it’s all over for another year! This year’s Bank Holiday Flower Festival was up to its usual high standard, one that was first set way back in 1961.

The local media at the time of this report mentioned the two arrangers who helped pioneer the event back in 1961, and still remain very much to the fore now. Paddy Moseley and Iris Bourne – involved since the festival’s inception!

They now laughingly admit that no one back then really had too much of a clue about flower arranging. “I had to buy a book so I could learn How to Arrange Dahlias,” said Paddy. “We all joined in to make it a success,” said Iris. “I can remember knocking on someone’s door on the first day and asking if I could take their lovely display of red-hot pokers from their garden – of course they agreed immediately”.

Both ladies are adamant that the festival is just as friendly today as it was back then.

“We have met people who tell us our standards have made this the best such village display in Kent – and that is a wonderful compliment. The great thing is that the atmosphere is the same as it ever was – we are all amateurs, having a lot of fun to put on what is, hopefully a tremendous show for the public”.

Much of the above holds to this day but has become established as a vital date in so many diaries, and along with enjoying the magnificent flower arrangements (still done by amateurs and still utilising flowers from local gardens!) the many stalls, musical entertainment and wonderful refreshments on offer really make for an occasion you cannot afford to miss.

Need help to reduce your heating bills!

The Borough Council is working with the Greater South Net Zero Hub, which has received more than £118 million in government funding to launch a scheme called Sustainable Warmth. This will enable local authorities to help deliver energy-saving improvements for people who are struggling to pay their heating bills.

How the scheme works

The **Sustainable Warmth grant offers energy saving home improvements, like insulation, renewable heating systems and solar PV**. This could help our residents **reduce energy bills, make homes warmer and more comfortable**, and lower carbon emissions.

Warmworks is responsible for the whole customer journey, from the initial sign-up process through to a property survey, the installation of energy saving improvements and a quality inspection to ensure that everything has been fitted in line with Government standards.

Funding is available for **homeowners and private tenants who live in a home with a low energy rating and have a household income of less than £30,000 a year, or unemployed and receive an income, health or disability benefit**.

Grant eligibility

The primary focus of the Sustainable Warmth scheme is to upgrade **privately owned housing occupied by low-income households, where the combined household annual income is less than £30,000 gross (before tax or any other deductions) or under £20,000 after rent or mortgage costs**.

For owner occupiers, the grant is up to £10,000 to help pay for the cost of installing insulation upgrades, low carbon heating or renewables.

Those properties that are off gas (HUG1 scheme) can receive up to £25,000, depending on type of fuel and EPC rating (EPC E, F and G only).

For privately rented properties, the grant is up to £5,000 under LAD3 and variable under HUG1. In order to qualify the tenant must meet the income eligibility and the landlord will need to contribute a third towards the cost of the upgrades. Only homes which have an EPC rating of band E, F and G are eligible for help under the scheme.


