A Letter from the Ministry Team at St Peter & St Paul Church, Appledore

Dear Friends

Walking along the lanes close to my home this afternoon I suddenly became aware that mingled with the scent of wet, newly cut wood was another perfume. Until this moment I hadn't realised that the insignificant flower of the Winter Heliotrope has an aroma akin to vanilla. Growing mainly in waste places, unloved by gardeners because of its invasiveness, and easily over-looked, the plant is named for a character in Greek myth. The Nymph Clytie had a serious crush on Helios, god of the sun, gazing longingly up at him as he rode in his chariot from east to west across the sky each day. Needless to say, he cared not a fig for her - in fact he didn't even notice her presence! In time this daily devotion took its toll on poor Clytie and (quite apart from developing a stiff neck, one imagines) she eventually became rooted to the spot, just her head turning slowly as she continued to keep her face towards the sun. Winter Heliotrope echoes her behaviour through its brief wintry flowering period.

Gloomy February is a difficult month, especially when, for one reason or another, life is a struggle. We are feeling it especially in 2021. We need a glint of light in the darkness, something to cheer! The church's festival of Candlemas on 2nd February marks the end of the 40 days of Christmas. (Aha, if only we'd realised we could have kept the Christmas lights and decorations up!) Coming halfway between the Winter Solstice and the Spring Equinox it is a moment when one can start to look forward to lighter, longer days. Traditionally this was the day when the many candles needed to light the church during the coming year would be brought there for a blessing - the Candle-mass. One can imagine the church ablaze with light, casting a cheerful glow on faces exhausted by winter deprivations. In terms of the church's year Candlemas commemorates the day upon which Mary and Joseph took the baby, Jesus, for his first visit to the Jerusalem temple. He was recognised by Simeon and Anna, two aged and faithful dwellers there, as the Holy child whom God had promised would be Saviour of his people. He would be 'a light to lighten the Gentiles'. In church we often sing 'The Candle Song' at this time:

Like a candle flame Flickering small in our darkness Uncreated light Shines through infant eyes God is with us, alleluia God is with us, alleluia Come to save us, alleluia Come to save us. Alleluia!

Stars and angels sing Yet the earth sleeps in shadows Can this tiny spark Set a world on fire? Yet his light shall shine From our lives, Spirit blazing As we touch the flame Of his holy fire

By the end of February the flowers of the Winter Heliotrope will be gone, but there will be Spring flowers to replace it, providing us with a much-needed spark of hope and light. The natural world reflects the cycle of the faithfully turning year, reminding us that we can look forward with hope even in the most bitter of times.

'MUSEUM-WORTHY' WINDOW

Last year we were approached about a window that was discovered within the wall of 10 The Street when it was being renovated some years ago.

The window needed rehoming to a safe place, preferably where experts would be able to glean information about the window and perhaps even renovate it.



We are happy to say that we found such a home thanks to Leonie and Caroline who work at Canterbury Cathedral. The window has been given a home by Charles Brooking, an Architectural Historian. His collection is used as a learning resource, as well as being a National Collection of various building related artefacts representing past periods.

The window is Palladian in style and contains very thin glass that would have been locally mouth blown. The style includes sections that are raised, called

rustication. Some of the glass is a beautiful red colour with a pattern painted on it. The window still has its hand-made nails in it, catches which indicate how it opened, and lead strips. Above the window is a carving which we are hoping might be better identified when experts have looked at it.

The window is thought to be from the middle 17th century, and it is only due to its careful storage since discovery that it is in a fairly good condition, which highlights the need for extreme care to be taken when any works are carried out on our older buildings here in Appledore, and especially the Listed buildings.

APPLEDORE HERITAGE COLLECTION

Work is continuing on the creation of our small museum in the Methodist Chapel. Once we were sure that we had a committed space for our collection to be displayed, we applied for £300 under the Kent County Council Combined Member Grant Scheme 2020/2021 and, thanks to Cllr Michael Hill's recommendation, our application was successful.

These much-needed funds will be used to obtain items to help us create a good display of our collection. Such items are an A Board for publicity, a laminator, a guillotine, steps, photo albums and various materials to enhance displays in cabinets and on the walls.

We would also like to extend our thanks to Paddy Moseley for her kind donation of three large display cases which were moved to the museum in January.

Parish Council Update January 2021

Parish Council Zoom Meetings

As per the guidelines, the council will continue to hold online meetings through zoom for the moment. The council meetings can be joined through the website from the home page. The website address is https://www.appledore.kent.org.

Court Lodge Residential-Enabling Car Park

Although the archaeological works are nearing the end, they might not have been completed by this month. A few artefacts have been found and will be sent away for cleaning and documenting. In the meantime, work has started on making a footpath from the car park to the exit by the telephone exchange near the canal and the parking and delivery area for the site is being created. Discussions between Court Lodge Developments and Planning Officers on drainage for the site and car park are underway. Court Lodge Road frontage has been cleared and a new fence and hedge erected matching those of the adjoining property. Some residents can remember that this is how the garden looked when they were young.

The application for 5 dwellings (an increase of one home on the original plan) was approved in December.

Appledore Parish Council Precept

The council set its share of your council tax at the January meeting. This is known as the precept. The precept remains unchanged at £26,000 for the coming financial year. The average household (band D) will pay around £77 which is just less than £1.50 a week.

Public Toilets Refurbishment

The public toilet refurbishment is almost complete and these should be open by the middle of February latest. Please note that the harris fencing has been removed and so the toilets look open but that may not be the case.



Census March 2021 (will provide a snapshot of modern society)

Households across Ashford Borough Council will soon be asked to take part in Census 2021.

The census is a once-in-a-decade survey that gives us the most accurate estimate of all the people and households in England and Wales. It has been carried out every decade since 1801, with the exception of 1941.

It will be the first run predominantly online, with households receiving a letter with a unique access code, allowing them to complete the questionnaire on their computers, phones or tablets.

"A successful census will ensure everyone from local government to charities can put services and funding in the places where they are most needed," Iain Bell, deputy national statistician at the Office for National Statistics, said.

"This could mean things like doctors' surgeries, schools and new transport routes. That's why it is so important everyone takes part and we have made it easier for people to do so online on any device, with help and paper questionnaires for those that need them."

Census day will be on March 21, but households across the country will receive letters with online codes allowing them to take part from early March.

The census will include questions about your sex, age, work, health, education, household size and ethnicity. And, for the first time, there will be a question asking people whether they have served in the armed forces, as well as voluntary questions for those aged 16 and over on sexual orientation and gender identity.

Results will be available within 12 months, although personal records will be locked away for 100 years, kept safe for future generations.




