

New Councillors

We would like to welcome Toby Davis and Chester Lusk to the parish council. Although both are in full time employment, they are both prepared to find the time to work for the community and are already actively supporting the council. More information on them is available on the website.

Councillor Vacancy – Helen Hennig

We must thank Helen Hennig for all her time and effort that she has spent working to benefit the community. Helen joined the parish council in June 2015 and threw herself into bringing the public toilets up to scratch making them a very pleasant convenience. At the behest of County Councillor Mick Burgess Helen set up Friends of Appledore Station. Helen regularly brought residents concerns to the parish council which in turn has led to the creation of Friends of Appledore Footpaths. Helen advised that she will continue to work for the community but not as a parish councillor.

Highways Gateways for the Village

Councillor Hiskey will for the moment cover Helen's responsibilities on Highways and Councillor Wilkinson will assist him. At the last meeting the council agreed the final plans for gateways into the village which will consist of a mixture of road surface roundels and picket fence style gateways according what was physically possible and highways approved. The final cost is £8,541.31. We have been advised that Highways may be able to erect these around September this year.

PCSOs

We were fortunate to have one of the local PCSOs attend our last meeting. In future, PCSOs will be attending one in three parish council meetings. Residents were encouraged to continue reporting all incidents no matter the size to the online fault reporting or 101. The number of PCSOs covering the area, continue to fall and the public were asked to bear with the service if the service takes time to get back to them. Neighbourhood Policing will be shortly under review and this may affect the number of PCSOs further. Residents were asked to respond to the public consultation when it comes out later in the year. Just a reminder that all urgent calls should be made to 999.




A WALK ON THE WILD SIDE

Don't think we were very good at all that stuff
So thank you Dad for all you did
With much love from us three kids

Last month we said we hoped to be able to provide an insight into the life of Kitto Juleff, and we thank his daughter Sharon for providing the following:

"Our father, Kit Juleff, passed away after a short illness on 19 March. Kit had moved to Appledore with our Mum, Mina, in 2003 to be near their daughter, Sharon, and her family. Mum soon became active in the Church and WI and, together, they settled into village life.

When our Mum passed away in 2009, the village put its arms around my Dad and helped him through those difficult times. He grew to love the village and its people and was truly at home there. He was happiest walking down to the village store and chatting to whoever he met - especially if they had young children or dogs! Every November, he would walk through the village, knocking on every door to raise money for the Royal British Legion.

The latter years were difficult. There was the pandemic and our Dad's knee was making movement difficult - he had suffered a serious injury in the Army that came back to haunt him. Once again, his friends in the village rallied around and we cannot thank enough, all of his friends who supported him, especially Helen and Tim, Rhona and Les and so many more.

Kit had a rich life that he could probably not have imagined growing up as one of seven children on a small farm in Cornwall. Facing National Service anyway, he chose to volunteer for the Army as the pay was a bit better. He chose the Life Guards, the senior regiment of the British Army, as he was familiar with horses (the Regiment had, and still does have, a ceremonial role escorting the Monarch in addition to the main armoured role) but also because the recruiting sergeant offered recruits a guinea if they signed up!

In a long and varied career, Kit served as part of the British Army of the Rhine, where the life expectation of tank crews was 24hrs should the Soviets had attacked. Service also took him to Cyprus during the 1963-64 conflict and N Ireland during the Troubles. More pleasant postings included the Trucial Oman States, Aden, Singapore, Uganda, N Ireland and Cyprus again (this time without the risk of being shot at!). He rose to the rank of Squadron Corporal Major (the equivalent of Squadron Sergeant Major in lesser regiments) and thoroughly enjoyed his career. The highlight, however, was the times with the Mounted Squadron in London, working with

horses and escorting his beloved Monarch on ceremonial occasions. Not a bad life for a farmer's son from Mithian.

Kit was a tough old soldier who hid, not very well, a big heart. He loved his family, children, dogs and horses, not necessarily in that order. A very proud Cornishman, he became a contented Appledorian and the village was his home.

Thank you again to all those that ensured that our father was supported and surrounded by friendship and love during his time in the village."

Finally – Beware and Stay Alert !!
