

From the Vicarage

I'm writing this just a couple of days after hearing the news of the death of His Royal Highness Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh. With people across the nation and the Commonwealth and beyond we share their sense of loss and offer our condolences to Her Majesty the Queen and her family.

Prince Philip has been someone who has been beside the Queen, who has been, she said, her strength and stay for all the years which have been the longest reign our nation has ever known. It's hard to think of the royal family without him. And first our thoughts and our prayers are for our sovereign lady Queen Elizabeth and all members of the royal family in their bereavement.

As we, hopefully, continue to head towards a more normal way of living, we continue to thank God for all those who have worked so tirelessly to bring us through this pandemic. The nurses and medical staff, all hospital workers, those who have worked on the vaccination and the roll-out of it, to our shop workers and all those who have done 'their bit' to help others. A huge heart-felt thank you from us all.

<u>Childhood Memories of A Life in Appledore</u>

In the early 1950s when Hawthorn Estate was completed and the first families moved in, only one family had a car, Mr & Mrs Chapman at Number 21. This meant that, apart from the occasional delivery vehicle, the road was traffic free, giving the children their personal playground.

Many a child learnt to ride a bicycle and roller-skate up and down the road in Hawthorn. It was also ideal for homemade go-karts.

For the youngsters it was as good as a sports stadium. On the kerb outside, where Hawthorn House is today, was a black painted line, from here to the kerb in front of Numbers 14 & 15 (at the bottom of Hawthorn) it was 100 yards, the distance for many races.

Where the lamp-post is today, a rope would be placed across the road, one end secured to the lamp-post (which was on the opposite side of the road then) and the other end fixed on the top of the opposite bank. This was considered a suitable net for playing tennis. Other sports such as football and cricket were also played on the road.

When the Council cut the grass it could be raked into large piles and used for jumping over or landing on when practicing somersaults.











Look Out – There are Thieves About!

Security of Vehicles and Valuable Assets

Prompted by PCSO Kate Richards' March Newsletter, I took the decision to add security markings to my garden machinery, to supplement the home security systems that we already have installed, and I highly recommend that other Appledore residents consider this option.

Having purchased a Vehicle Marking Security System last year from RETAINAGROUP (an Ashford based company), I revisited their website (www.retainagroup.com) and ordered a 'Business Assets Pack' from their online store.

The process of using the system is very easy and provides for security marking on all garden machinery and other valuable home assets. It is inexpensive at £16.80 per pack, with the capability of permanent security marking for 20 items.

The company maintain a secure register of all recorded items on their own accredited, secure database. It is a lifetime, free-of-charge record.

Criminals are at maximum risk of being caught and prosecuted if they steal a protected item as police and members of the public can check if a marked item has been reported stolen by calling the register's 24/7 telephone number, included within each mark. This enables the recovery and return of stolen items to their rightful owners.



An interview with Ray and Sandra from The Black Lion

A week after Sandra celebrated her 73rd birthday and Ray celebrated his 75th birthday, I had the pleasure to sit down with them to ask how they had fared over the past very difficult year. The Black Lion is at the heart of our village and they have been here 25 years.

How have you both been?

Ray: Health-wise we have been not too bad. We have both had our second jabs but it has been hard, as it has been for everyone.

Sandra: Yes, it has been hard for everyone - everybody is in the same boat...

Except you have got a business that involves, or should involve, the whole village.

Ray: The village has been really supportive, and we are very grateful. There is no way we would have survived if it hadn't been for the regulars supporting our take-away business.

The first lockdown was much easier because we had all the sunshine and the summer, and I was able to deliver. The second lockdown was a lot harder – it was winter, and delivery was very difficult. Sometimes I couldn't see the houses – being older and it being so dark, I couldn't see so well! Then it had to be collection only. People probably didn't feel like coming out to collect – it was freezing cold...

I was wondering - were you ever scared about your own health?

Ray: No, not really. We took all the precautions that were necessary, sanitizers everywhere, we made sure the people did the track and trace.

Sandra: And we didn't go out anywhere or come into contact too much with other people.

I'm thinking – how do you weigh up business with your own personal health?

Ray: We did think about that, but as I say, we took all the precautions you can take – it's the luck of the draw to a certain extent as well.

Sandra: There's not much really you can do about it... you've got to survive; you've got to do what you can to earn.

Do you think you've had to become more creative in finding ways to keep the business going?

Sandra: Yes, I think so. We did some specials to keep people interested, you know, especially the regulars who come every week. And the specials went very well.

What were your highs and lows of 2020? (Pause...) Were there any highs?!!!

Ray: (Laughter) – I think on the first lockdown we were very, very positive as we were very, very successful! We probably made more money being closed! It was only the two of us.

The staff were all furloughed, we were working 15-16 hours a day, 7 days a week. We were up at 7 in the morning and working till 9 o'clock at night. Sandra was making all the food, and then there was all the cleaning as well of course!

Sandra: It wasn't just answering the phone, doing take-away beers – you've got all this other stuff going on in the background. If I was cooking till 8 o'clock at night, I was so tired, I couldn't wash up as well because I was dead on my feet, so I got up early in the morning and blitzed through before the rest of the day when you are prepping up for the evening. So, It's like a continuous thing...

Did you know how much food to get in?

Ray: The wastage was higher than normal

Sandra: Yes, it's very hard to judge it you think, "Am I going to be that busy this week?" I'd better prep all the potatoes and everything... and then you don't get the orders...

So what did you do? Does it just have to be thrown away?

Sandra: Yes, much of it did – such a shame...

So that was a high (laughter) – what about the lows?

Ray: Easter 2021 was a disaster. Our worst in 25 years. We geared up for a really busy Easter Sunday. Sandra put four different roasts on and it was the worst Easter we've ever had.

Why do you think that was?

Sandra: I think it was probably because people were getting together with friends and families outside in gardens – I don't know..

Ray: I think families got together in gardens because the weather was quite reasonable.

And that was because the government had made the decision to open up – so you are juggling all the time with decisions that sometimes have to be made quite suddenly?

Ray: Yes, for example, after the Eat Out to Help Out we carried it on and this was really successful and everybody appreciated that and so we were getting more and more stock in, I was getting more beer in, Sandra was getting all stocked up and then suddenly, we're closed again at a day's notice. So probably £300-£400 food got put in the bin. Luckily, the brewery gave us a refund on any untapped beers but even that was a very complicated process. I had the big beer delivery on the Friday and on the Saturday, they closed us down. That was a low – that was a really bad low...they closed us down right out of the blue.

Sandra: Yes, but everybody was the same - we are all going through the same scenario and everybody is struggling.

Ray: The Government grants have helped, they were most welcome.

Sandra: But I think overall we have been very fortunate – we didn't have a rent to pay or a mortgage. We own it outright – if we had had to find the money for those things...

Ray: We would have gone bankrupt – without a shadow of a doubt.

Sandra: A lot of people have been in that situation and I feel really sorry for them because they have lost their business. So really and truly we have been very lucky

Ray: Last Monday when we opened, I could not believe the number of people we had – We were wondering whether to open at all. Sandra didn't think anyone would come out in the cold, but I said, well, let's give it a try.

I got a couple of staff in and it was rammed! People with scarves on and heavy coats on – but they were there! I brought my camera down to take photos, but I didn't get time to take any!

What has kept you going?

Sandra: Survival – you've got to, so you just keep going. Basically, you just get on with it. You get a bit depressed sometimes but then you...got to survive. Ray gets more down than me sometimes, but we've got each other to say, "Come on – keep going!"

What about Christmas and New Year – was that a bad time? Were you all set up for that?

Sandra: Well, the worst was not being able to see family. I went to see my son to just pass presents over the fence! Like for everybody else, it was hard.

Ray: I haven't seen my daughter for over a year – and my granddaughter had a baby last week too!

Sandra: I have a daughter in Cyprus I haven't seen for four years. We text and speak on the phone but it's not the same...

Ray: At Christmas we thought we were going to be open but we thought "No, we can't take any bookings – we cannot risk it. We'll play it by ear." We thought we can always get turkeys last minute and can put a menu together quite quickly. But as it turned out, we were closed anyway!

So, moving on to the next big event at The Black Lion – in June – the GIG on the Green! Tell us about your plans for that.

Ray: We did a charity event two years ago and raised about £1500. One of the singers – a professional – has had no work for a year – she helped in the bar for a while. She approached me and said they'd like to do a gig here and that they didn't want any money. We are going to do something outdoors, weather permitting and indoors if not. I'm going to do a pig roast and possibly a paella as well. The barbecue will start at 4pm and the singing from 5-7pm.

And what about the big opening when people can eat inside again. What plans have you got for that?

Ray: We have some ideas - plans are coming to fruition. All the precautions are in place as before. Each table has the Track and Trace for the phone – though we do have the cards to fill in for those without phones.

How do you see the Future?

Ray: Well, we are going to retire. We actually had a buyer for the pub about a month before the first lockdown came; the price was agreed, they had a surveyor sorted to come. This didn't happen and it all fell through. We are going to put it back on the market pretty soon.

So really the future ...looking forward to retirement.

Sandra: I'm looking forward to just having a normal home where I can just sit in the garden in the morning and have breakfast outside in the summer and maybe do a bit of gardening! All these little things! I'm also looking forward to seeing the family more. They'll get fed up of seeing us I bet!!!

Ray: It's four years since we've had a holiday!

Sandra: Everyone is yearning for a holiday! It'll make us appreciate it more when we get one!

Finally, have you got a message for the people of Appledore?

Sandra: Just thank you very much – you have been wonderful.

Ray: Yes, just a really big thank you for all the support they've given.

Sandra: And without them we wouldn't have survived – we wouldn't be here – we wouldn't have survived. Yes, very grateful. Thank you.


Gary Kinsley: Nominee for a position on the Parish Council






