Dear Friends, On Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> June, we will celebrate Pentecost and hear again the story of those early disciples Luke records Jesus' promise to his followers that they would receive the Holy Spirit - finally experience the fruit of that promise. And, lo, the Christian Church is born.

I think over the years we have perhaps not given enough attention to the Holy Spirit, this final part of the puzzle of the Trinity. But, with eyes open, we may well see signs of the Spirit everywhere: at baptisms, weddings, funerals; at every Eucharist and in every blessing; in the kindness towards the dispossessed and homeless; in the doggedness of Christians throughout the world who, through thick and thin, continue to live the gospel; in the lives of Christians in their daily life and work; even in the darkest places of the world, where all hope appears to be lost, caught so poignantly in the inscription on the walls of a Nazi concentration camp in the 1940s: I believe in the sun even when it is not shining.

In the final analysis the Holy Spirit is, as Jesus promised, the one who helps us, fortifies us, empowers us to continue our Christian journey. The Spirit is our Advocate, our Counsellor, our Comforter, our teacher, the one who sets us apart to act as witnesses to God's unending love and care for the world he has created. The Spirit is perhaps the greatest gift of God to his church, indeed a foundation stone of that church to which it gave birth.

So, we should embrace the Holy Spirit, give thanks for it, and allow it to fill our lives with optimism and hope.

#### Gardening Time - Advice from a successful grower

Hi all. Now that we're in the month of June sit back and enjoy all those wonderful blooms.

Your bedding plants should have been planted out now. When those roses are just about to drop their petals, it's time to start

dead heading but don't just take the flower head off, take it down a little bit lower to a leaf axle. You will then get a lot more blooms during the summer.

In the greenhouse your tomato plants need watering regularly, If you end up watering them and then forgetting about them they could well end up with blossom end rot where the bottom of the tomato goes black. Don't forget to pinch out the side shoots that are coming out from the leaf axles. You just want one stem growing up and after the third flower truss if it's a medium sized tomato or beef steak, take out the growing point. Feed with a high potash food. Keep well ventilated and at night damp the floor down it can help to keep red spider mites at bay.

If you're growing sweet peas and you wish to show them at Stone flower show in July here's a hint - to get the best blooms you need to grow the plant as a cordon, pick out all side shoots and all tendrils and you will end up getting larger blooms. For showing you need four strong blooms but if you manage to get five all the better.

Gardening is like farming you are fighting everything, pests, weeds, disease and the weather. You think you've got it right then it all goes down the drain but if it all comes together boy is that a happy moment

The twelve acres of tranquil gardens at Godinton House are surrounded by ancient parkland studded with stately oaks and chestnuts, enclosed by one of the longest yew hedges in the Country. In 1896 the gardens were formalised with terraces and a rose garden. A scheme of restoration and replanting began in 1996 by the Godinton House Preservation Trust. There are herbaceous borders, a lily pond, Italian and Wild Gardens, and a walled kitchen garden is still used for growing produce today. Not forgetting of course, Godinton has an exceptional collection of delphiniums and in June it's Delphinium Festival!

#### The Ramblers Walk 16<sup>th</sup> May 2025

It's ramble day again and a lovely hot sunny day it is too! Today we are walking to St. Thomas Becket Church at Fairfield on the Romney Marsh. This morning we dropped some cars down to the lay-by opposite the Church so that we can drive back as both ways is too far for our group!!


So 12 of us and no dogs set off from the rec. walking down through the narrows and over the bridge. We pick up footpath AT126A at Bridge Farm which brings us out on the road to the turkey farm. After a short stretch of road we cross another footbridge and onto the AT126B. At the moment the footpath here can be seen but sometimes the crops mask where the footpath goes. We walk straight across the field until we reach another footbridge where we take a left and follow the edge of the field until we reach a substantial stile that takes us over the railway line that runs between Ashford and Hastings via Appledore and Rye. We cross another stile and 3 of our group come in for a bit of stick because we have to walk through stinging nettles and they are wearing shorts!!! We carry on following the Snargate Sewer, on the other side of which lambs skip about enjoying the sunshine. We continue on through arable fields planted up with wheat and rapeseed. One of our newest ramblers Richard is really knowledgeable about birds and as we are walking he points out a red kite, a cuckoo that looks a bit like a long tailed pigeon but with wings that droop downwards and some noisy reed warblers.

The footpath bears right and we follow another sewer until we reach Brack Pumping Station. A man in a white Land Rover is positioned here and according to the sign on his Landy, he is the Internal Drainage Board for the Romney Marshes Area. We say hello because we are a friendly bunch, but also because he is the first person we have seen for miles! He says hello back and then asks us if we would like a look in his pumping station!!! As there are 12 of us we feel it is safe to say yes, so he unlocks the door and we all file in! Brack Pumping Station was built in 1909 and the Pump is called Invincible. The guy was very proud of it and has maintained it for over 25 years for the Internal Drainage Board. He told us all about it and although some of it was rather complicated, our basic understanding is that the station pumps water around the sewers in the Winter to avoid flooding and in the Summer to provide irrigation in the area. We thank him for our impromptu visit and carry on. We are now on footpath HM43 and this part is quite hard walking as it is rather uneven and overgrown in places. We spot a swan sitting on a well-hidden nest in the reeds and eventually cross an electric fence into a sheep field. We walk along the edge of this and a very overgrown stile comes out by the railway line on the road. We turn left and walk along stopping to pick up the key for the Church which hangs next to the gate of Becket House. A little further up the road we go left through a gate and into the field that surrounds St. Thomas Becket Church. A Church has stood here since the 13<sup>th</sup> century although it was restored in the 18<sup>th</sup> century. It is filled with bright white box pews and a very rare triple decker pulpit rises over them. After a look round we pass the key on to the next visitors and carry on our way. We walk across the back of the Church and over a series of footbridges that take us over the Marsh. The scenery is beautiful and everything quiet and peaceful apart from the rustle of the trees and the sound of birdsong. We carry on until we reach Brack Lane which we then walk along back to the road, where we parked our cars earlier. We are now all in need of a drink and decide to drive to the Woolpack Pub at Brookland which is a 15<sup>th</sup> Century former Smugglers haunt. It has low beams and a large inglenook fire place and has recently got new Managers in. We sit out in the very big garden and enjoy a well-deserved drink in the sunshine!

Appledore book club was delayed by a week this time so we all had an extra few days to finish In Her Shoes by JoJo Moyes. Most of us really enjoyed it, though there were a couple who having read previous books by the same author thought it didn't flow quite as well. It started a little slowly then gained pace as we read about two women who accidently swapped bags at the gym. It was a book all about the empowerment of women. At first, beautiful high heels gave confidence whereas plain, scruffy flats just didn't. It was more than about shoes though. It was about support and not needing the material things to make you a better person. Though, we all thought it was quite a unique idea to smuggle diamonds in your high heels!

Then we discussed a few books for our next read. First a Robert Galbraith (aka J K Rowling) but some wondered if they'd already seen a Strike Episode of the same story. Then The Alice Network by Katie Quinn (a historical novel, a female spy recruited during WW2, a young pregnant girl sent abroad until her problem had 'disappeared'. A mesmerising tale of courage of redemption) - we have bookmarked that for a future read. So we settled on The Island of Sea Women by Lisa See (set on a Korean Island called Jeju two friends set to work in the sea with the village's all-female diving collective. They begin a life of excitement and responsibility but also danger. Set over many decades, including a period of Japanese colonialism in the 1930's and 40's, then WW2. the Korean War and it's aftermath). We hope it's a good read.


